
Instructions


- 1. Print each page of the pattern. Be sure to print the pages at "Actual size" or scaled to 100%. Margins are set to 0.25 inches.
- 2. Once printed, you'll need to match up all the pieces of the pattern and tape together. After the pattern pieces are attached together, you can attach the patterns to your wood. You should have the following patterns:
 - · Main body of the gnome
 - Head (with beard, hat, and nose)
 - Nose
 - Hands
 - Arms holding sign
 - Feet
 - Base
- 3. I recommend using 1/2" plywood for this project. A 4x4 ft sheet should be plenty.
- 4. Use a jig saw to cut out all of the pieces.
- 5. Assemble the pieces loosely to make sure everything fits. Sand all pieces so they will fit properly and be ready for a finish.
- 6. Add a final finish and glue the pieces together.




Gnome Main Body Next 10 Pages






























Gnome Arms Holding SignNext 4 Pages












Gnome Head, Beard Next 6 Pages


Note: Cut out as one, then separate along the line that says "CUT HERE".

You can also separate the ball on the end of the hat.














Remaining pages include Hands, Feet, Nose & Base
